Shrewsbury Public Schools has committed to the use of technology to enhance teaching & learning. In December of 2011, the School Committee voted to accept a set of strategic priorities that included having all students in grades 5-12 being educated in 1:1 learning environments by 2016.

Beginning with the 2015-16 school year, the district will move its 1:1 program to a district-owned device model, while still enabling students to use their iPads both at school and at home.
